

The Pupil Premium is an allocation of additional funding provided to schools to support specific groups of children who are vulnerable to possible underachievement. These include pupils who are entitled to free school meals; those looked after by the local authority and the children of armed service personnel.

All schools are required to report on the amount of funding received and how this is being used. Once information is available, the impact of the funding should also be reported.

For the academic year 2013/14, Earsham has received £21,500 in Pupil Premium funding. This has been used as follows:

- To set up a Nurture class provision to support children with social/emotional needs or when a crisis affects this area of a child's development.
- To provide intervention/booster programmes for all groups of children as needed.(children will be identified at pupil progress meetings.
- To provide lunch time nurture / support groups.
- To purchase resources needed to enable intervention and groups to take place.
- Including staff training.
- To provide opportunities for disadvantaged children to attend after school clubs, educational visits and residential trips.

£7000 will be carried forward for the summer term as pupil premium is paid by the academic year and not the school financial year

Outcomes for 2013/14 spend

Families in crisis feel well supported by the school.

There were no exclusions in 2013-2014.

Attendance has increased for the 3rd year in a row.

2014 in school gap at KS2 for disadvantaged pupils is closing in maths reading and writing.

Updated funding for 2014/15 is £35.100

The funding is being used as follows.

- To continue to resource Nurture class provision at a cost of £25,000 for the financial year. Including staff training and specialist support when needed.(this will be in addition to support from School Support Team)
- To continue to provide disadvantaged children with opportunities to attend after school clubs, educational visits and residential trips.
- Lunch time premier sports club starting with year 5 children in autumn term.
- Continue to provide intervention/booster programmes for all groups of children.

A carry forward for the summer term of 2015 will be £14,625

Outcomes for 2014/15 spend

Families in crisis continue to be well supported by the school and outside agencies working with school confirm this.

There were no exclusions in 2014-2015.

Attendance across the school continues to be good across the school and when attendance dips for individual pupils support is quickly put into place to ensure persistent absence does not occur. Comparative data with national figures will be given as so as they are available.

Lunch time play leaders have enabled vulnerable pupils to join in with support led activities.

Updated funding for 2015/16 is £33,300 (£300 for a services child was used in the summer term).

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- To continue to resource Nurture class provision at a cost of £25,000 for the financial year. Including staff training and specialist support when needed.(this will be in addition to support from School Support Team)
- To continue to provide disadvantaged children with opportunities to attend after school clubs, educational visits and residential trips.
- Lunch time premier sports club now twice a week.
- Continue to provide intervention/booster programmers for all groups of children. Booster groups running in the autumn term before school for year 5&6 children continuing into spring term with addition of booster groups
